In April 2018, the Patchogue Medford Library's Board of Trustees passed a resolution setting forth it's commitment to establish a library branch at the Medford Athletic Complex, subject to the Library receiving sufficient funding from the town of Brookhaven and the Medford Hamlet Foundation. This pilot program will begin in February and last through early April.


Beginning Tuesday, February 4 from 12-3 pm


