A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR:

I hope this newsletter finds you and your family healthy and well. Spring is in the air and hope is on the horizon!

Our Annual Budget vote and trustee election will take place on Tuesday, April 6 from 9:30 am to 8 pm. Last year the Library Board voted to cancel the 2020 budget vote due to the pandemic, taking no increase for a full year, while maintaining the level of service that you have come to expect. Our Library staff has continued to adapt to these challenges, being tasked to do more with less. The community now has access to more remote services than ever before, including getting and renewing library cards online, virtual programming, increased streaming and downloadable products, and a robust YouTube channel. We've added more hotspots to increase access to wifi, created a community food pantry and increased access to social workers to address the very real needs of our community. This year, while you will see a slight decrease in funding for workshops and events, let me assure you that you will continue to have access to all of the wonderful quality classes and programs you have become accustomed to. During the pandemic, we've been able to adapt some of our practices and streamline our classes and supplies. We've also moved away from offering hospitality and planning large events (due to Covid-19), and the budget reflects those changes.

We will continue our great success with virtual programs while beginning to introduce outdoor and some smaller group in-person workshops and events as well. Work continues on our Medford Branch Construction Project. Stay tuned and check our website for the latest up-to-date information.

Speaking of our website-we are ready for an upgrade! The staff has been working hard to update our current website to make it more user and mobile-friendly. We plan to launch the new website in late April and welcome your feedback and questions.

Please mark your calendar for the in-person Library budget and trustee vote (see below for some words from our excellent candidates) and feel free to come to our virtual budget hearing and Meet the Candidates meeting on Tuesday, March 23, 2021 at 7 pm if you have questions.
