Our teen staff and security are dedicated to creating an environment where all teens feel welcome and included.

We still hope to have a late spring opening and will keep you posted through our website as we work through the winter to finish the project. We are currently bidding out the parking lot that will be constructed in front of the building. We are truly excited about what is to come!
