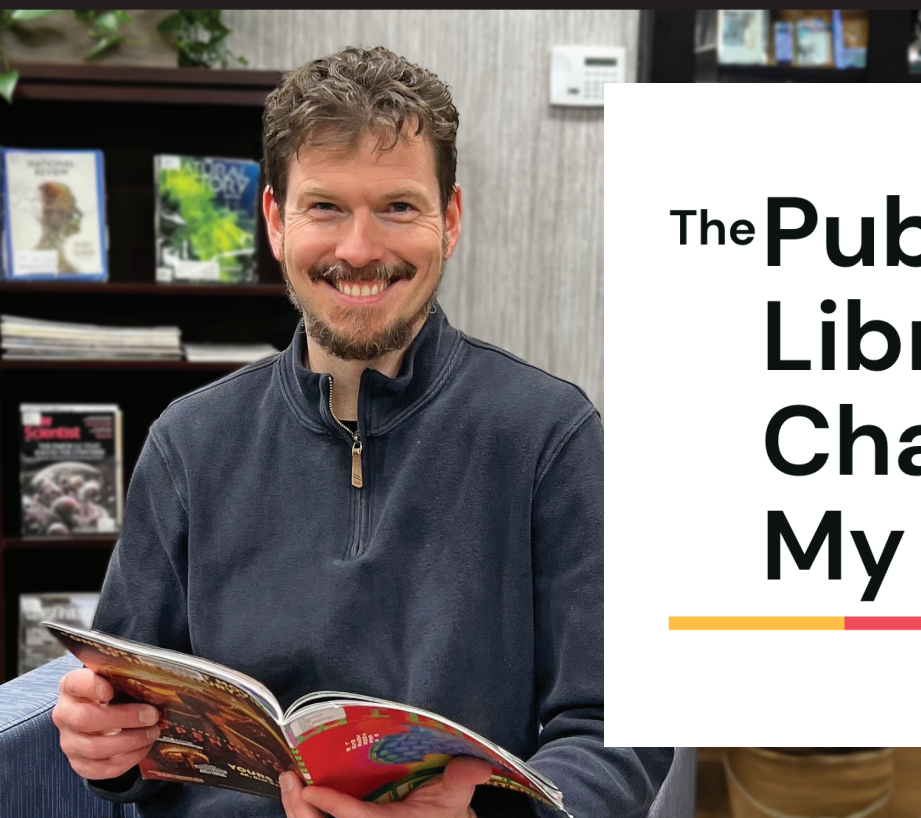

**Our Annual Budget vote and trustee election will take place on Tuesday, April 2 from 9:30 am to 8:00 pm.**

Harold Trabold, current Board of Trustees President, is running unopposed on the ballot this year. For thirteen years, your Library Board of Trustees and Administration have been committed to increasing access to library services in our community without sacrificing great customer service and remaining under the tax cap. The Patchogue-Medford Library added the Carnegie Library Teen Center in 2016, and has experience adding the care, maintenance and staffing of an additional building to our budget. We have built the new Medford Library branch by relying on grants, donations, collaboration with our local government and efficient spending. The opening is very close, but still pending. Stay tuned for opening dates!

This year, you will see a decrease in spending on the items we circulate in our buildings. Please know that we will continue to have a complete and highly desirable collection of physical and digital media, as well as Library of Things items and museum passes available to the community. By analyzing what collections are being used most by our community, we can order items in a more efficient manner. Our collection development team meets regularly to ensure that we are taking in all the feedback provided by our community and then purchasing accordingly. You will see an increase in funding for our classes and events to meet the demand for educational, empowering, and entertaining programs for all. You will also see an increase in our employee salaries. Our employees are the lifeblood of what we do here in the library and out in the community. We will meet the contractual obligations for Library employees, including exponentially rising health insurance costs, and add a few key staff members (pages, custodians, security) to help run our Medford facility. This will ensure a safe experience for all. More often than not, the employees hired for these positions come directly from our community, supporting economic development and ensuring that our employees truly know the community we serve. The library board and administration commend the amazing Library staff for the efficiency, commitment, perseverance, and innovation that they show in the service they provide to our residents every day.

The stories shared by those on our cover are a testament to the important role that public libraries play in our communities. Please come down to the Main Library Building and vote on Tuesday, April 2.
