It's so exciting to see so many new faces; the building is being used even more than we ever dreamed. As we look to best serve residents at the Branch, we will continue to evolve our programs to match what you are asking for - please give us feedback! Scan the QR code, we want to hear from you.

We hope you all enjoyed an exciting summer participating in the **Adventure Begins at Your Library summer reading experience.** It was nice to see so many of you at the Library for reading, reporting, free lunches, summer classes and workshops; and out in the community at AA5, Circus on Main, Shorefront Park, and the Medford Concerts. We challenged you to read 5 books over the summer to keep your reading skills sharp and over 1000 children and teens took the "Strive for Five" challenge. A special thanks to our wonderful Friends of the Library group for sponsoring the prizes for our amazing summer readers. And speaking of the Friends of the Library, be sure to check out their upcoming book sale on Saturday, September 7 from 10 am-3 pm. These amazing volunteers keep the regular thrift shelf stocked and curate great discount sales for all the book lovers in our community.

We had a banner summer finding new residents to sign up for library cards - 191 new cards at the Branch in just the first 16 days! (on the cover is Amelia getting her first library card at the new Medford Branch) - but we want more! **September** is Library Card sign up month! Your library card can give you access to so many services, free books, podcasts, music, games, equipment, discount tickets, museums, classes and workshops. Come visit us at any of our three buildings or reach out online at pmlib.org/get-a-card to get started today.

At the Main Library, we are continuing to update the look and feel of the space.

- The main pathway flooring was replaced and looks clean and new.
- We are working with local and nationally recognized artist Cara Lynch to create a mural in the main stairwell that will be an exciting, joyful and colorful addition to the Library. Even more exciting is that the community will be able to participate in its creation! We are hosting a drop-in Community Painting Party behind the Carnegie Library on Saturday, September 7 from 12-4 pm. Stop by and be a part of this exciting project! The Zoeller mural, currently in that location, will be removed and preserved to be displayed in a new location, coming soon.
- On display on the Main Floor for the month of September is a historical exhibit called Recognizing Women's Right to Vote in New York State - curated by Julia Corrice, Susan Goodier, and Sally Roesch Wagner of the South Central Regional Library Council, in partnership with the Empire State Library Network and New York Heritage Digital Collections, with funding from Humanities New York.
- The Copy Center is bustling, the Marjorie Roe Reading Room provides a respite for our readers, and the Tinker Lab and Sensory Space have given children new areas to explore. Our Makerspace continues to be booked with appointments and we are looking for ways to expand access to the machines and staff. Presently we are able to offer patrons up to two appointments per week, so please plan ahead for those upcoming holiday projects!

Finally, celebrate our diverse community with the Library - this month there are so many ways to get to know your neighbors: The St. Liberata Italian Festival and Bocce Tournament on September 7, all the Hispanic Heritage Month activities happening from September 15 to October 15, and Arts on Terry with Patchogue Arts Council on September 22.

Whether you're back to school or just waiting for pumpkin spice season to begin, we look forward to seeing you at the Library.


