

Birdsong by Sebastian Faulks

"This beautifully written novel is a mixture of fact and fiction, dealing with love and war without romanticizing either, but makes the reader feel the depths of both. With WW1 as the backdrop, two characters deal with different degrees of tragedy. The woman, trapped in a loveless marriage, is profoundly guilty of having an affair, and the young man, unable to find love or a feeling of belonging, is committed to a bloody war. The story is an extraordinary commentary on what was experienced by young boys during WW1, who were hardly old enough to know why they were fighting and how the trauma of war shaped them. The author skillfully placed the reader in the tunnels and trenches, as well as in no man's land on the front, and one could feel the anxiety, terror and fear the soldiers had to cope with every minute of the day and night. Ironically, I finished reading the book on Memorial Day and suddenly that day had new meaning for me. This book is highly recommended and is available at the Library and electronically on Libby. There is also a DVD available entitled Birdsong that was very true to the book."


The Making of "It's a Wonderful Life"
