BOOK REVIEW Anxious People by Fredrik Backman

Anxious People is a heartwarming and witty novel about a botched bank robbery that turns into a bizarre hostage situation. Through a diverse cast of flawed yet lovable characters, Backman explores themes of anxiety, human connection and second chances. His signature blend of humor and poignancy shines as he delves into the struggles and vulnerabilities of ordinary people.

The novel's nonlinear narrative and multiple perspectives create an engaging, layered story that keeps readers invested. While at times chaotic, the storytelling ultimately reinforces the idea that everyone carries unseen burdens. Backman's compassionate writing makes Anxious People more than just a comedic crime drama—it's a touching reflection on the importance of empathy and understanding.


