The Patchogue-Medford Library will celebrate its 125th year of service beginning this December!

Our original charter notes that the Library officially began its deep-rooted work in the community on December 20, 1900 at 3:30 pm. The Carnegie Library was our first location and remained so until 1981, when the opportunity arose to move to the former W.T. Grant building on Main Street. This expansion allowed the Library to grow to more than ten times its original size, providing additional space for materials and community gatherings.

The Library has evolved alongside our beautiful Patchogue-Medford community, always honoring our history while continuing to look toward the future and meet the needs of our diverse patrons. Today, the Patchogue-Medford Library consists of three locations that serve thousands of people in countless ways. We are deeply honored to serve our community, make a difference in the lives of our community members, and to provide opportunities for education, empowerment, and enriching entertainment for all.


